CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

CHURCH NEWS

LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH In 2020, the Church of England produced a book entitled '*Living in Love and Faith: Christian Teaching and Learning about Identity, Sexuality, Relationships and Marriage.*' The aim of the material is to help churches embark on a learning journey and begin a conversation about these important issues. In September, there will be a short sermon series on three key areas, after which there will be the opportunity to join a short course exploring the issues in more detail. The Archbishops hope that as many people as possible will engage with the material which will help the Church of England to make whatever decisions are necessary for our common life going forwards. WAYS TO SERVE IN THE CHURCH As church life begins to return to a greater degree of normality in the autumn, please do be thinking about ways in which you can serve. Help is always needed setting up/setting down at services, welcoming people on the door, serving coffee/tea after the service, leading intercessions, helping at Junior Church, helping at Little Saints, etc. If you're not currently involved in any church activity, how might you be?
