CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

If you need communion brought to you where you sit, please tell the Welcome Team. If you do not receive communion, do come up for a blessing if you wish.

CHURCH NEWS AND EVENTS

UPDATE ON SERVERY AND WC INSTALLATION The work continues to go well and on schedule. All the major pipework has been laid underground, and the trenches covered with gravel outside and with the original stonework inside – the corridor from the west door through the choir vestry looks particularly impressive, such that it is likely that no carpet will be needed. The only remaining subsurface task will be the connection to the sewer via a manhole in the road, which will have to be closed for a short period. The servery and WC have been fitted with electricity cables, the walls insulated and internally skimmed ready for painting. Our decision to apply a lighter tone of varnish to the outside woodwork of the pod has been communicated to the DAC for approval. A further decision is needed from us about the floor covering in the gallery above the pod; we have samples of the options that will be on display at services. Do peek through the barriers to see what's happening.

CHURCHYARD SPRING CLEAN UP Many thanks to the few loyal, hardworking folk who did a great job in the churchyard last Friday evening and Saturday morning. The Garden of Remembrance in particular looks amazing. Well done, on behalf of the Cottenham Resources Action Group.

HEARING LOOP We have now re-established the loop which appears to be working reasonably well. However, if there are still difficulties, we apologise. Each Sunday, whoever is preaching will come with printouts of their sermon. Pick one up from the church table if needed or read on the website.

SUMMER AT ALL SAINTS Each year, we run a series of social events to bring people together over the summer. Last year we had a pizza night at The Chequers, a walk around Milton Country Park, a film night with fish and chips, and an afternoon tea. What would you like to see this year?
